In the archives of the Marshall News Messenger, it was written of this building, "**N**o retail business in Marshall was ever more famous than the "anchor" of the city's business community, the Joe Weisman and Company. Joe Weisman first opened his mercantile emporium in 1878 on the east end

of Peter Whetstone Square... A few years thereafter, he moved across the street to the north side of the square. By 1898, Mr. Weisman had purchased the site of the former King House Hotel on North Washington at Rusk and the adjoining livery stables. Quickly, an amazing 25,000 square foot building emerged, unlike anything then in Texas. Skip forward to 2003, after closures, reopening and restoration, the building was awarded the prestigious Historic Preservation Award from Preservation Texas. To drive by now, we believe that committee would be equally as delighted. The former Weisman Building with its recent antique coop and Central Perks Restaurant space is now the Marshall Mercantile, owned and operated by the Shoults family. Within you will find cuisine from High Horse 1898 ~ traditional favorites with a Texas flare. You will find Marshall Floral, catering to both special events as well as the general public with custom floral arrangements. You will see a mercantile filled with treasures, a museum space, and an event venue seating 500 or space for quaint gatherings and showers in the upstairs floors. Downtown is bustling.

Whether you visit Bear Creek Smokehouse, of international fame, ride their famous longhorn and eat a little BBQ, <u>OR</u> visit the Marshall Mercantile, you won't be disappointed.
